




HOW TO HELP

DERMATOLOGY AND LAPAROSCOPIC HERNIA REPAIRS NEW TO HOSPITAL

The Canterbury Charity Hospital continues to update its services this year including dermatology for young people and hernia repairs using laparoscopic equipment.

Hernia referrals have increased over the past few months as the public health system has once again stopped providing this treatment.

Historically patients underwent open hernia repairs (surgery) but it is now a more common practice to offer laparoscopic hernia repairs.

"Patients are able to recover and mobilise quicker and have less pain from smaller incisions," says clinical nurse manager Averill Williamson.

Treatment of scarring as a result of severe acne in young people is another new service and will be provided at the hospital by volunteer dermatologist Grant Bellaney.

"For some people scarring has a huge impact on their lives and there are a number of medical and surgical treatments (such as laser resurfacing and fat transfer) that I'm hoping to offer," says Grant.

These patients can be seen at the Charity Hospital if they can't access the public health system, have a referral from their general practitioner and don't have the financial means to access their treatment privately.

GARDENERS CREATE BEAUTIFUL SPACE

Gardener Wayne Lovell started volunteering at the Charity Hospital eight years ago when there were just two buildings and the garden was only at the front of the hospital. Now with five buildings his workload has increased considerably and, for the last five years, he has been helped by hospital neighbour Russell Saunders.

Not only does Wayne volunteer at the hospital but his wife Helen has been helping out as a nurse in the Endoscopy clinic for 11 years.

Russell enjoys working at the Charity Hospital two to three times a week and keeping busy during his retirement.

"As a retiree I have the time to help with the gardening at the hospital. It's an enjoyable way to give time to a very good charity and it also helps me keep active and meet new people," says Russell.

NEW RECEPTION AREA AND ENTRANCE

The Charity Hospital team of volunteers is looking forward to having their own dedicated space to catch up with each other once renovations to the new building on the corner of Harewood Road and Leacroft Street are completed.

The building will also become the new entrance to the hospital off Harewood Road and provide a much more spacious reception area with additional administration space.

The Canterbury Master Plumbers Association has come on board to provide all the plumbing, drainage, installation and flatware for free to help cover their costs.

"We knew the hospital was struggling with the expense of the renovations and decided unanimously that we and our business partners would love to help out such an awesome local charity," says association president Mike Diver.

The renovations contracted to Naylor Love and overseen by IKON Architects will be completed by the end of August.

VOLUNTEERS ENABLE FREE SERVICES

The Charity Hospital treats people with the greatest need who cannot access publicly funded treatments nor have enough money to pay for their treatment privately.

The team of 300 volunteers at the Charity Hospital enable them to continue to provide their free treatments and surgery - without any Government funding.

Surgeons, dentists, anaesthetists and nurses often have to take time out of their regular jobs to help out at the hospital and many are there every week.

The hospital's currently provides: Colonoscopy (acute and screening); Gynaecology and women's health; General surgery (abdominal, rectal including hernias); Oral surgery and dentistry; Orthopaedics (upper and lower limb); Cataracts; Dermatology; Dietetics and Urology.
